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### PAYMENT AND MAIL-IN FORMS

Payment and mail-in forms are due by July 1, 2019. No payment will be refunded after July 1, 2019.

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# REGISTRATION

Institute participants should register on Sunday, July 21 between 2:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. in the lobby of Building H

(Student Housing) on the Concordia University campus.

- The first general meeting will be held at 6 p.m. Please plan to be settled in your dorm room prior to dinner.

### CHECKOUT AND DEPARTURE

All students should plan to depart the campus about 2:00 p.m. on Friday, July 26, 2018.

Please make every effort to allow students the opportunity to attend the final session 1:00-2:00 on Friday afternoon. Early checkout involves making both Concordia representatives and Championship Debate Group staff available at problematic times. Please do not plan to pick up students early.

## SPENDING MONEY

Spending money depends entirely upon individuals and their parents/guardians. The activities of *The Championship Debate Group* program do not necessitate the expenditure of much money. Students are responsible for their own in-library duplication of original research material.

#### Students are urged not to bring large amounts of cash with them.



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There is no banking service available per se. There are several Automated Teller Machines located on campus. If a student does not have an ATM card and needs additional money mid- institute, commercial services like Western Union and American Express are available in Austin.

# **STUDENT HOUSING**

Student Housing is a modern, air-conditioned dormitory. Two or three students of the same sex will share a room and a bathroom. Students are responsible for upkeep of their own rooms. Please note that CX debaters may have practice rounds in their rooms, so keeping a neat room is a must.

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# CLOTHING REQUIREMENTS

Dress on campus is informal. It is typically warm in Texas in July, although the air conditioned dormitories and buildings can be quite cool. We suggest that students plan a summer wardrobe, but that they bring a couple of garments to layer over their summer clothing if they find the classroom temperature a bit chilly.

Students enrolled in prose/poetry interpretation and extemporaneous speaking need performance clothes for the Friday performances.

#### COMPUTERS

Students should plan to bring their own laptop computers and/or tablets if at all possible. While the campus library has computers available, it has become evident that most students find they are more productive with a laptop or tablet computer. Wireless connections are available in individual dorm rooms and in classrooms.

Students in cx debate should plan to print all their evidence before the institute begins if they do not bring laptops.

The Championship Debate Group is not responsible for the loss of a student's personal property, including computers. The campus is a safe and secure one; it is, however, always advisable for students to lock their dormitory rooms and to take great care and caution to maintain their belongings. Practice debate rounds may be held in dormitory rooms with the students' knowledge and permission.

### CLASSROOM SUPPLIES

Supplies are largely an individual choice. Different students have different likes and dislikes, and should, for the most part, choose the size, color, shape, etc. of supply that works best for them.

In general, students will need a notebook and their choice of other papers to take notes. Students should print any files they need before the institute begins. It is also useful have some means of transferring files from computer to computer (a jump drive). Instructors may email students near the date of the institute instructing them to bring specific supplies.



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#### **RECREATION AND FREE TIME**

The curriculum schedule is a full and challenging one. However, we do believe in the importance of fun and recreation. A well-rounded institute experience is one that works to sharpen each student's skills *and* encourages him or her to get to know others in both working and social environments. A gymnasium and recreation center with fitness machines may be available. Students will have access to pool tables, ping-pong tables, and foosball tables in the lobby of the dormitory.
